On Rosh Hashanah we provide a festive, holiday snack of apples, challah, honey, and juice to bring in the sweetness of the New Year. Please provide a snack and/or lunch for your child on Yom Kippur.

3rd-5th Grade Program 10:30 am-1:30 pm JR. SERVICE!

In addition to stories, craft, skits, and "hang out time" in the education classrooms, the 3rd-5th grade students will enjoy a TEEN LED Junior Service from 11:30 am-12:15 pm in the small chapel. Snacks will be provided on Rosh Hashanah.

At 1:00 pm, students will join the main service for the Torah reading and shofar blowing in the sanctuary.

- Children must be signed in for all youth drop-off programs.
