The \(\bar{1}\bar{2}\bar{\chi}\) is found in the Amidah, the third section of the Shabbat morning service.

The Amidah consists of a number of prayers praising God for various parts of our world and lives. The first three prayers of the Amidah (Avot, Gevurot, and Kedushah) are chanted out loud by the leader and the congregation. The remainder of the prayers are chanted/read silently.

Although many of the prayers of the Amidah are said silently in the Shacharit (morning) service, the first three (3) prayers are said out loud as a community. The \(\Delta\)i\(\Delta\) is the first prayer of the Amidah and is said out loud by the community at the Shacharit service. While reciting the \(\Delta\)i\(\Delta\) we bend our knees and then bow from the waist at the beginning of the first line and at the beginning of the final line. We do not bow at the end of the Gevurot.

The \textsup \textsup \text{connects us with and reminds us of our past. It reminds us that Jews have been trusting and worshipping the same God for over 2,000 years, since the time of our ancestors. It reminds us that our ancestral mothers and fathers are to be honored for the devotion to God that made it possible for us to be the Jews we are today.
